Saying Power

And when he saw a fig tree in the way, he came to it, and found nothing thereon, but leaves only, and **said unto it**, Let no fruit grow on thee henceforward for ever. And presently the fig tree withered away (Matt. 21:19)

Jesus *said* something to the tree that caused it to whither up and die. Jesus had *saying power*. Did He only do this because He is God and we are not?

- 1. Jesus states with abundant clarity that we are able to do exactly as He did:
 - a. Matt. 21:20-22
 - b. Jesus is God and the Creator of all things. But when Jesus came to earth, He came as a man and did not operate with any God-like advantage that we lack.
 - c. Jesus says in the passage above that we are able to do the exact same thing He did if we would apply one simple element faith in God.
- 2. When to pray and when to SAY
 - a. In Matt. 21 we also learn that Jesus offered no prayer to God the Father. He spoke directly to the obstructive object.
 - b. God once rebuked Moses for praying when he should have been exercising his God given authority Exodus 14:13-16
 - c. Joshua learned this truth Joshua 10:12-13
 - d. David Learned this truth 1 Sam. 17:45-50
- 3. Learning to speak in line with God's Word.
 - a. We must learn to say things that line up with God's promises.
 - b. **Because you have** <u>said</u>, I am in the hands of the Lord, the Most High is my safe restingplace; No evil will come on you, and **no disease will come near your tent**. For he will give

you into the care of his angels to keep you wherever you go. In their hands they will keep you up, so that your foot may not be crushed against a stone. You will put your foot on the lion and the snake; the young lion and the great snake will be crushed under your feet (Psalm 91:9-13; Bible in Basic English)
